Year 2 have been learning about different art techniques. They recreated Van Gogh's style.



### Headteacher's Newsletter

Dear Parents,

It's been a truly jam-packed week at school, starting with our visit from Andrew of SIAMS on Monday. We are incredibly grateful to all the parents, staff, church members, trustees, and governors who generously gave their time to speak with him and share what makes our school special. Andrew was thoroughly impressed—especially with our children. He even remarked that some of the conversations he had with them will stay with him forever! We expect his full report to be published within the next three weeks, and we will share it with you as soon as it is available. One piece of feedback that particularly resonated with me was this: "The school is a joyful community, and the pupils love being here."

On Tuesday, I had the pleasure of joining Year 5 on their trip to Juniper Hall, Box Hill—a new visit inspired by our vision to broaden pupils' experiences of nature. It was a wonderfully active, hands-on learning day, giving the children the chance to carry out real field studies. They explored the geology of our local area, its importance as an ecosystem, and the impact humans can have on it. This ties perfectly into our JOY project, which we've mentioned in recent newsletters, and provided a memorable experience for all involved. It was a joy to spend time with Year 5, and they spoke so positively about everything they learned.

It was also fantastic to see so many of you at the PTA AGM on Tuesday. We reflected on the incredible work achieved last year and looked ahead to exciting projects planned for this year. Funds raised will support a range of initiatives, including the hoped-for replacement of the swimming pool changing rooms, further development of our JOY project, and smaller resources that enrich daily learning. The PTA will also continue to support the school minibus and environmental garden. If you have time, skills, or work for a company that supports local charities, please do get in touch—we would hugely value your support.

Yesterday, the whole school (except Reception) gathered at the church for our Harvest Festival. It was a beautiful occasion, and we were moved by the generosity of families whose donations will support the Woking Food Bank. In assemblies this week, we reflected on the Gospels and the spread of good news around the world. I encouraged our children to consider how *they* can spread good news by living out our values. Your donations to the food bank are a powerful example of putting others first—thank you for your kindness. Reception were not left out, but had their own service this morning.

Finally, next week marks our first Parents' Evening of the year—a valuable opportunity for teachers to share how your child has settled into the new school year, their aspirations, and ways we can work together to help them achieve their potential. In light of this I share this <u>article</u> that might be of interest in supporting learning at home. We look forward to welcoming you.

#### IMPORTANT SAFGEGUARDING NOTICE: CHILDREN'S "SPY" BOOKS

We want to make you aware of a recent issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the *Spy Dogs, Spy Cats*, and *Spy Pups* series.



Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content.

The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books and is working with schools, libraries, and retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

#### What this means for you:

If your child has any *Spy Dog*, *Spy Cat* or *Spy Pups* books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the site. If you have a school copy, please return it to the office.

It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves — the concern is only with the outdated link.

We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses in books without checking with an adult first.

Behaviour Tip: Postpone decisions

When it comes to consequences, get used to saying, 'I need to think about what happens next' or 'Let's come back to this later'.

It is important that your response to tricky behaviour is well considered, fair and proportionate. Reacting in the moment rarely allows us to give this response to our children.



The consultation runs from 1 October to 30 November

A Parish Council provides true localised consultation and decision making accountable to the local electorate. It can provide key local assets and services such as community centres, playgrounds, green spaces and allotments. It promotes a sense of place, pride and belonging in the community. This is particularly important at this time because by April 2027 Woking Borough Council will cease to exist and local decisions will be made by a Unitary Authority (West Surrey) representing around 500,000 people.

A Parish Council will give us a local voice.


