Headteacher's Letter

Dear Parents,

I hope you've all had a lovely week and are looking forward to a restful weekend. It's been one of those slightly unusual weeks for me, as I've spent a lot of time out of school attending a variety of training courses and information sessions. While it's always a bit of a juggle to be away, I do enjoy the chance to reflect, learn and bring back new thinking to share with the staff team — and, most importantly, to help enrich the learning experiences of our children.

One session that really stood out to me focused on recent research into the effects of screen time on children's brains. The study looked at the impact of blue light exposure and showed that as little as two hours a day on a screen – whether that's a phone, tablet or laptop – is enough for the brain to begin developing addictive patterns. Even more striking was the finding that children who are withdrawn from regular screen use can begin to display symptoms very similar to ADHD, including restlessness, difficulty focusing, and irritability. It was a powerful reminder that although technology plays an important role in our lives, especially in learning and communication, it's vital that we help children develop healthy habits and routines around screens. Here in school, we work hard to ensure that screen use is purposeful, limited and always balanced with physical activity, creativity and social interaction – and we encourage the same kind of approach at home, too.

Back in school, it's been another busy and exciting week, and I want to take a moment to celebrate some of the wonderful things happening in our community. Firstly, a heartfelt thank you to Mrs Daniell, who has been working with all the children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 over the past eight weeks, delivering high-quality swimming lessons. Her patience, encouragement and expertise have helped the children make brilliant progress in both their water confidence and safety skills, and we're incredibly grateful for the positive impact she's had.

I'd also like to say a big thank you to our amazing PTA for organising such a successful Summer Fair last Saturday. It was a fantastic event, full of fun and community spirit, and it was lovely to see so many families enjoying themselves. These events take a great deal of time and effort to organise, and we are truly appreciative of the team's commitment and energy. The money raised goes directly back into supporting our children and enriching school life — so thank you to everyone who came along and supported.

Following the fair, many of our Year 4 pupils headed over to the church for their brass concert – and what a brilliant performance they gave! It's not easy to stand up and perform in front of an audience, but the children rose to the occasion beautifully, sharing everything they've learned with confidence and enthusiasm. It was a lovely end to a busy day, and a real celebration of their musical progress.

Looking ahead to next week, we're all very excited for our Year 6 pupils as they set off on their residential trip. This is always such a special experience — a chance to build independence, try new things, and make lasting memories with friends before they move on to secondary school. We hope they have a fantastic time and really squeeze every bit of fun and learning out of their final few weeks with us. These last days of primary school are precious, and we're here to support and celebrate them every step of the way.

Finally, a quick reminder to all families about morning drop-offs. If your child attends Breakfast Club, please remember that drop-off should be no earlier than 7.45am. For all other pupils, school gates open at 8.30am. We ask that children are not left before this time, as there are no staff on site to supervise them. We want to ensure that all children are safe and properly welcomed into school each day, so thank you for your support in helping us manage this.

Wishing you all a wonderful weekend – hopefully with a little sunshine, some screen-free time, and plenty of opportunities to relax and enjoy time together.




