Behaviour Tip: FEAR response

Understanding the way we respond to tricky behaviour is useful. We often experience FEAR (False Experiences Appearing Real). The escalation of our own worries can take us from seeing our children showing age-appropriate resistance to worrying they will be terrible humans and spend their lives alone. Try to identify the next time FEAR shapes the way you react to your child's behaviour.

We know as parents of primary school aged children that we are continually navigating the tricky years of screen time and phone pressure. In little over 15 years, smartphones have changed the shape of childhood. And the evidence they're doing more harm than good has become impossible to ignore.

Yet we've been left to figure this out alone. There's no roadmap. No NHS guidance. No government policy. Just families everywhere trying to do their best, up against the most powerful and persuasive companies on the planet.

Please make time to watch this short video (linked below) designed to spark honest, supportive discussions between parents and children about why waiting a few more years to get a smartphone is a good idea. If your child is aged 10-13 it is a good idea to watch it with them. If you agree, please sign the pact to support Pyrford CofE Primary's vision to agree to delay getting your child a smartphone until at least 14.






Pyrford Neighbourhood Forum

The consultation runs from 1 October to 30 November



It can provide key local assets and services such as community centres, playgrounds, green spaces and allotments. It promotes a sense of place, pride and belonging in the community. This is particularly important at this time because by April 2027 Woking Borough Council will cease to exist and local decisions will be made by a Unitary Authority (West Surrey) representing around 500,000 people.
