Headteacher's Newsletter

Dear Parents

It's safe to say we're now fully into the swing of things! Nothing shows this more than those slightly cooler morning starts — and, of course, the Year 6 Bikeability sessions. It's been a wonderful week across the school, full of excellent learning. I even had the chance to lead an assembly in Cedar class and teach some maths on Thursday, which was a lovely reminder of the joy of being back in the classroom.

You may have noticed members of the leadership team out on the gates in the mornings, greeting families as they arrive. This change is partly linked to our work with *When the Adults Change (WTAC)* and partly to make sure we're more visible and available for any questions. Please do say hello if you see us — and don't worry if the children don't always respond; some are naturally a little shy, and we don't want them to feel any pressure. Over time, this will become just another part of the daily routine.

Speaking of WTAC, this is one of the priorities in our School Development Plan for the year ahead. Each summer, we reflect on what has gone well, and where we can grow further. This year, we've chosen to focus on the following areas:

- **Relational Practice:** Embedding a relational practice approach across the school in partnership with *When the Adults Change (WTAC)*. This will help us continue to shape a learning environment that supports children's wellbeing, engagement and academic outcomes.
- **The Joy Project:** Creating a whole-school approach to enriching children's experiences through oracy, physical movement, safe risk-taking and creative play. We are especially grateful to the PTA for their generous funding which will allow us to develop our site to support this exciting work.

Alongside these two big priorities, we'll also continue to:

- Strengthen our inclusion work with parents.
- Review and refine our approach to the teaching of writing.
- Collaborate with other schools in our Trust to explore how AI tools might support teaching and learning, while also helping pupils understand both the opportunities and challenges AI brings.

Our staff are reinforcing our school rules of being *ready, respectful* and *safe* at all times. The children have responded positively, especially with their efforts to use 'walking feet' along the corridors. It's been wonderful to see them take this responsibility on board.

As part of the Joy Project, we've started looking at how to redesign our playground spaces to allow for different types of play. This week, for example, we moved some benches onto the verge, freeing up more space for fast-paced games while also creating calmer areas for those who enjoy more creative activities.

Finally, I wanted to share news of an exhibition at Guildford Cathedral running over the next few months. Among the artists featured is Jacqui Parkinson, whose work has been inspiring our assemblies this term as we've revisited the story of creation and other early stories from the Bible.

Rules allow us to teach behaviour. What are the rules in your home? You should think about them and note them down.

Ask your children, separately if you have more than one child, what they think the rules at home are.

At school we use 3 simple rules which are 'Ready, Respectful and Safe'. They cover all behaviours: from putting our lunch boxes on the trolley in the morning; to walking safely around the school; to looking after our classroom resources.

Think about how you might be able to use 'Ready, Respectful and Safe' at home and what that might mean for teaching your children the behaviours you expect to see.



5 WILLOW - **Numaan** for his thoughtful and creative work on Creation in RE. He showed great reflection in his picture, thinking


carefully about what he is thankful for and wants to celebrate. It was lovely to see how he used art to express his ideas. Keep up the fantastic work Numaan.




