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Headteacher's Letter

Dear Parents,

This week, we began with a moment of remembrance, reflecting on the sacrifices of soldiers in past conflicts. At 11 o'clock, we observed a two-minute silence and discussed the importance of this tradition with the children. It was a moving moment, and I was incredibly proud of the children's impeccable behaviour and respect during this time.

The week has been both busy and productive. On Monday afternoon, we welcomed our School Improvement Partner, Carol Pearce. She carried out a learning walk focused on our school's Christian distinctiveness and how it is woven into various aspects of school life. Carol was very impressed by the high standard of learning observed across the school, and the children demonstrated excellent attitudes toward their studies.

We also had the school photographer visit on Tuesday and Wednesday, bringing plenty of excitement as the children posed for their school photos—a memorable moment they all enjoyed!

I am also delighted to share the success of our Year 6 football team. The team made it all the way to the final and played admirably, though they ultimately finished second after a nail-biting penalty shootout. Losing on penalties can be tough, but reaching the final is a fantastic achievement, and we are very proud of all the players who represented our school so well. Congratulations to everyone involved!

On another note, I'm sure many of you have seen the recent news about Archbishop Justin Welby's resignation following the Makin Review. I want to reassure you that as a church school, we remain fully committed to the highest levels of safeguarding and training, with the safety and well-being of our students as our top priority. 2 CEDAR - Ada Gwyther In English we have been reading *Orion and the Dark.* The children rewrote a diary entry as Orion. Ada tried very hard with her writing and included feelings, adjectives and conjunctions, making it really interesting to read. Mrs Goree and Mrs Shardlow are very proud of Ada - well done!

2 HAWTHORN - Ali Zafar for working really hard in our Maths sessions. We have been subtracting 2-digit numbers and learning how to exchange when we have too many ones. Ali has shown great resilience when working through tasks and impressed Mrs Porter with his efforts. Well done Ali!



3 ELM - Audrey Jessup We designed and built our own seawigs (worn by rambling islands) inspired by an idea from our text. Audrey created a spectacular seawig complete with a mermaid, shipwreck and octopus. Wonderful imaginative work Audrey!

3 MAPLE - Mason Osborne-St Pierre for his excellent work in DT. Mrs Brockway was so impressed with his brilliant kite. He used the stapler effectively to make the tubes for his spars and to attach the tails. Great colour choices too Mason!

4 ALDER - Ginny Wood In English, Year 4 have been learning to use colons , to add more detail to their sentences. Ginny used her imagination to write

some excellent sentences describing magical items found within a mysterious vault.

4 LARCH - **Kira Howell** for the effort she makes in her writing. Kira always works so hard to apply what she has learnt and uses lots of elements of our writing toolkit to write effectively for different purposes. Her work is always a joy to read!

5 CHERRY - Abubakr-Ali Hussain for wowing Miss Dennis with his subordinate clauses used to describe an ancient garage in the book *Skellig*. The aim was to create mystery and suspense, eg "When I stumbled through the broken door, dust scattered everywhere."

5 ROWAN - Radley Westen for his fantastic work in Science, learning about the solar system. Radley produced some clearly labelled diagrams with good explanations of Copernicus' discovery of a Heliocentric Solar System compared to a Geocentric Solar System. Well done Radley, keep up the good work!

5 WILLOW - Charlie Shaile for his fantastic work in Computing. We have been learning how to create circuits and program them using our *Crumble* software. Charlie has been an excellent problem-solver and managed to debug the algorithm displayed on the screen. He also supported his peers in using the technology in the classroom. He has been a stellar student and an even better Digital Leader. Well done Charlie!

6 HOLLY - Tilly Waldron for her artwork. She produced fabulous onomatopoeia words in the Pop Art style, using vibrant colours and bold shapes to bring the art to life. Mrs Bull really liked how she used shading to create the illusion of 3D. Super work Tilly!

6 LAUREL - Sienna Cottrell Mrs Gilbey was so impressed with her work in RE. We have been discussing the connection, as most Christians see them, between prophecies in the Old Testament about the Messiah, and events from the life of Jesus. Sienna explained clearly and concisely how the Last Supper is a prophetic event. Well done Sienna, keep up the great work!




