Headteacher's Letter

Dear Parents,

It has been a pleasure to welcome all the children back after the Easter break! I hope you were able to enjoy some special moments with your families and that everyone feels refreshed and ready for the exciting, busy term ahead.

This week in assembly, we explored the final part of the Easter story with the children. We reflected on the emotions of those involved—discovering the empty tomb, encountering angels, and witnessing Jesus' return and ascension to heaven. We spoke about the hope and joy that Christians take from this story and how its message can remind us that, even in challenging times, better days are often just around the corner.

As we begin the summer term, I'd like to take this opportunity to remind families about our school uniform expectations. Children should come to school in the correct uniform, including proper school shoes (not trainers). If your child prefers, they may bring trainers to change into once at school for playtime. Long hair should be tied back, and hair accessories should be sensible in size and preferably in school or neutral colours. We're also encouraging our junior pupils to ensure shirts are tucked in, top buttons fastened, and ties worn neatly. Thank you for your continued support with this—teachers will contact you if there are any ongoing concerns.

I also want to remind you that the **Online Safety briefing for parents**, held just before the holidays, is still available to watch (details below). This session was developed in response to feedback from our recent parent and pupil questionnaires, and it offers practical advice on the issues you highlighted. It would be a real shame to miss out on the valuable information shared.

The workshops and parent session were a significant investment for the school. If any families are in a position to make a voluntary contribution towards the cost, we would be incredibly grateful. Donations can be made via Scopay. If you know of a business that may be interested in supporting us, we would love to hear from you.

Finally, a quick note on parking: please remember that school car parks are for staff and authorised users only. Unfortunately, we've had instances where staff have been unable to access the spaces due to

unauthorised parking. We will be issuing permits to the small number of families with permission to use the car park. Thank you for continuing to park considerately in alternative locations.

Next week sees our boys' football team head to Pirbright School for the local school finals day on Thursday; we have a wonderful Perform workshop for EYFS & KS1 taking place on Monday and I am heading to Harrogate on behalf of the Surrey branch of my union, for their annual conference on Friday.



Parent and carer support

Supporting children who face additional challenges can be difficult at times. With that in mind, the Hope Service has created a space for groups of parents and carers to come together on a regular basis to discuss the challenges they face in a confidential and supportive environment.

These groups are specifically for parents and carers of children who would like additional support. You will have an opportunity to exchange experiences and receive support towards managing the often complex situations you find yourselves in. This is not a parenting class, rather a non-judgemental support group and we encourage you to talk about whatever seems most important.

Support is offered via Microsoft Teams by Hope staff members, which could include a Therapist, Nurse, Teacher, Social Worker and Hope day programme staff or outside facilitators.
