Headteacher's Letter

Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been another good week in school, despite the cold and wet weather trying its best to dampen our spirits!

We started the week by launching our new assembly theme, '**Shine Like Stars**', linked to the story of Daniel from the Old Testament. This week, we focused on Daniel's time serving in the court of King Nebuchadnezzar and how important it was for him to stay true to his beliefs, even when things were challenging. We talked with the children about how doing the right thing is always the right thing to do – even when it isn't the easiest choice. The children shared some thoughtful reflections, as always.

On Thursday, we were pleased to welcome the Headteacher and some colleagues from Horsell CofE Junior School to our site as part of our Trust work. We have been paired together to explore how each school supports children's spiritual development. This is something we care deeply about here. We want all of our children – whatever their beliefs or background – to develop a sense of their place in the world, an appreciation of what's around them, and to feel inspired by the wonder of it all. Our children and staff were fantastic, confidently sharing how we reflect on assembly themes and link the messages to our own lives in meaningful and practical ways.

A quick reminder for parents and carers at pick-up time: please do not enter the school building unless you have been asked to do so. We've had a few occasions where adults have accidentally wandered inside through open doors. If you do need to come into school for any reason, please enter via the office so we can sign you in and offer any help you might need. Thank you for your support with this.

In addition, we ask please that if children are attending Breakfast Club, you bring them to the hall door and not allow them to come unaccompanied from the church car park. This is particularly important if you haven't been able to make a booking for them as we would not miss them if they didn't make it to the hall.

We were absolutely delighted to receive **over 200 applications** for Reception places for September 2026. This is a real testament to the fantastic work of our staff and the brilliant start we give the children in our community. It's also lovely to know that so many parents are sharing positive messages about our school – thank you for your continued support.

1 OAK - Chanae for the fantastic and insightful contributions she made during our Computing lesson on staying safe online and our RE lesson focusing on Shabbat. Chanae engaged well with the learning and listened and followed instructions carefully. Well done Chanae, all the adults in Oak Class are very proud of her!

1 PINE - Abi-Rose & Maxim for their wonderful effort in English. As part of our learning about London, they built the famous landmark Big Ben out of Lego. They even added the four clockfaces to make it as accurate as possible. Well done!

2 CEDAR - Sienna In Art we have been learning about shades and tints. Sienna carefully added white systematically to create new shades. Great work!

2 HAWTHORN - Clara In our Art learning about shades and tints, Clara learned that if she added black to a colour, it quickly became darker, whereas when she added white, it slowly became lighter. Well done Clara!

3 ELM - Arabella This week we have been working on our multiplication skills. Arabella did a brilliant job, using a place value chart to accurately multiply 1 and 2-digit numbers. Wonderful work Arabella!

3 MAPLE - Hector In English, we have been reading *Krindlekrax*. We wrote a character description of the main character Ruskin. Hector used a range of adjectives to describe Ruskin's personality and appearance. He also included conjunctions to extend his sentences and used speech effectively. *Ruskin triumphantly exclaimed, "I am brave and wise and wonderful!" He used a croaky and squeaky voice.* Well done Hector - Mrs Goree can see how hard he worked on this piece of writing and is very proud of him!

4 ALDER - Amal In Science, Year 4 have been learning about how sound is caused by vibrations. This week we investigated how vibrations affect amplitude. We were so impressed with how well Amal worked with her partner.

4 LARCH - Amelie We have been reading a Revolting Rhymes poem about Goldilocks on trial in court. Amelie wrote her own fabulous version about the Wolf from Red Riding Hood in the style of Roald Dahl. We particularly enjoyed her use of emotive adjectives to describe the characters and onomatopoeia at the end!

5 ROWAN - Joshua for producing some fantastic work in Geography, showing excellent understanding of the Equator and the Northern and Southern Hemispheres. He demonstrated fabulous knowledge and explained his ideas clearly and confidently. It is clear that Geography is a subject he really loves. Keep up the great work Joshua!

5 WILLOW - Louis for showing fantastic knowledge and understanding of our English text during a hot seating task. He responded confidently and carefully to questions created by the class, using what he knew from the book to really step into the character of Jeff from *There's a Boy in the Girls' Bathroom*. He should be very proud!

6 ASPEN - Amelia for her amazing progress with reading. She has worked hard to read more fluently which has helped her to read faster. She has also worked hard with her comprehension skills. We hope she carries on enjoying what she is reading!

6 HOLLY - Mustafa Last week we welcomed a new member to Holly Class and Mrs Bull has been incredibly impressed by how well Mustafa has settled into life at Pyrford. He has made friends quickly and already feels as though he has always been part of our school community, taking everything in his stride. Mustafa has also produced some excellent work, including a wonderful story in English inspired by the adventures of Odysseus in Ancient Greece. A very warm welcome to Pyrford and well done Mustafa!

6 LAUREL - Ada for her fantastic work in History. This term in Year 6 we are finding out who the Ancient Greeks were and what their legacy was. 
