# Headteacher's Letter

Dear Parents,

What a week it has been! Full of excitement about World Book Day, Wonka chocolate bars, and the wonderful return of some sunshine; which has been a most welcome addition. We started the week in our assembly sharing the story of St. Martin de Porres, a Peruvian born in the 1500s, who joined the Dominican order and was renowned for his extraordinary charity and selflessness. We discussed how he chose to help others and put others' needs ahead of his own, and how we can take inspiration from his life to help those around us in our own community. A truly powerful message to carry through the week.

The beginning of this week also saw the start of the WASPS cross country event, which takes place over several weeks. Last but certainly not least - what a wonderful sight greeted us this morning! 




