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Good morning and welcome to our last newsletter of the Spring term. I can't quite believe that we will be returning and it will be the Summer term. As the weather warms up, please feel free to encourage your children to wear the summer uniform which can be found on the school website. Both girls and boys are welcome to wear the grey school shorts should they wish.

Many thanks to everyone who attended our Easter end of term service today. Hopefully you managed to gain a flavour of what goes on in school, particularly in relation to our weekly worship. We are very blessed in our community to be supported every week by parishioners who join in to deliver our 'Open the Book' worship which is based around stories from the Bible. Thanks also to Mrs Nightingale and Mrs Reynell who give their time to the children to develop music in the school; the children were a real credit to themselves and yourselves today. On the subject of music, our 'music house' has now been completed and is ready for occupation after the Easter holidays. The idea for this much needed facility was born a number of years ago and has finally come to fruition at very little cost to the school as we managed to successfully place bids and apply for grants. This facility will ensure that we complete our mission of ensuring every child at Pyrford has the opportunity to fully engage in music, learning to play at least one instrument and read music during their time spent with us.

Over the last week, we have had a number of new whiteboards installed. Nursery now have a fully interactive board as well as our new Reception class in 2019. Our music facility also has a fully interactive board to support music teaching along with our ICT suite in order to support IT lessons, enabling the children to see the teacher demonstrate on a large board whilst allowing pupils to carry out the same learning at their own pace.

This week Mrs Little and myself attended a conference in London where we were able to hear Damian Hinds speak about his intentions with regard to education which included; a pressure for the Government to increase funding, a drive to use more technologies to support teacher workload and a mission to recruit more graduates into the teaching profession. Mrs Little and I were pleased to see colleagues from around the country and to have the opportunity to both share the work we are doing here at Pyrford, as well as learning from others. Mrs McAllister (our School Business Manager) has also been out and about this week and had the opportunity to meet and work with the ESFA (Education and Skills Funding Agency). She was providing feedback on the accountability of Academies within the financial framework we work in. Rest assured Mrs McAllister is always flying the flag for Pyrford and lobbies to get the best value for children's education here.

Year 4 spent a fantastic 3 days away at Hindleap Warren this week. The children engaged in a whole range of team challenges and outdoor pursuits during the day as well as activities in the evening. My sincere thanks to the staff who accompanied the trip; not only have they dealt with every bodily fluid known to man but they have also helped make 78 bunk beds, sorted through 78 pairs of wellies, cleared two huge drying rooms, had approximately 2 hours sleep per night and still taught this week. Even though they were exhausted, all 12 staff members commented about what a fantastic experience it was.

Finally, I would like to wish everyone a super Easter break. Thank you as always for supporting the school, it is much appreciated. Enjoy spending time with family and friends and we shall look forward to welcoming you back on Tuesday 23rd April.




Governor Visit, 21st March 2019 - No Marking

Following the election to be parent governors, last week myself and Stephanie Dickens were invited to take a tour of the school led by Mrs Lines.

The tour gave us the opportunity to be introduced to the new “no marking” policy. Steph and I were uncertain how this worked but were soon convinced when we saw it in practice.

Before this academic year, teachers took pupils books home every night to mark work completed during the day. Ten minutes on thirty books equates to five hours marking. Not only is this time consuming and exhausting – there is no evidence to show marking in this traditional way improves children’s learning.

The new “no marking” approach is a mindset shift. “Marking and correcting mistakes” changes to “assessing and providing feedback” in class. To see this approach in action we visited a class from each year group.

In Year 3 English, the children had been given a task to write a short script based on the book they were reading. They had been given targets for success, such as using tension through short sentences, using adverbs and so on. They were grouped into zones in the room with the teacher moving around the room giving feedback as needed. As part of this new approach children are given purple pens to edit their own work, it’s called purple polishing. Mrs Lines gave us some examples of this in books after the tour. Spelling errors for example which were at the start of the work were picked up quickly by the children themselves and by the end of the work, through self-correction, these errors had been eliminated.

In Year 4 Maths, speaking to pupils directly we understood they were working in groups at different levels of difficulty. I spoke to a boy who explained that they start off with easy questions, then stop and self-mark these. Then they move to the next level. We also saw what are called the traffic light trays, which have a red, amber and green option for pupils to leave their books in. Teachers check books in the red and amber trays to pick up what are common misunderstandings and conduct spot checks on the books in the green trays. This helps teachers with their planning for later in the day or the following day.

The new “no marking policy” is interactive and allows pupils to work at their level of challenge and gives them ownership of their learning. Teachers move effectively around the class, spending quality time with each child. Any misunderstandings children have, are quickly resolved.

Making a change like this is innovative. It takes passion, trust, commitment and leadership to land it. It is clear all the teaching staff have these qualities and are working together to make this transformation at the school.

We’d both like to say a special thank you to Mrs Lines for taking time out of her day to give us this tour and explaining the new “no marking” policy.


