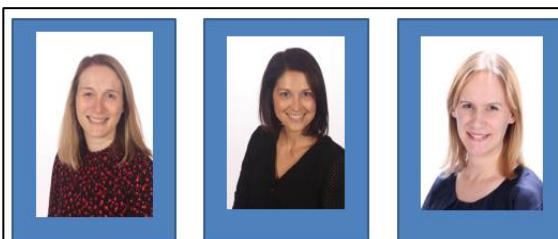
Welcome to Squirrels!

Physical Development

- We will be developing our fine motor skills through a range of activities such as playdough, puzzles, threading, and building
- The children will be encouraged to make marks with a variety of equipment
- We will be introducing scissor skills
- We will be playing and exploring in our garden. We will balance, jump and travel in different ways



This Term our topic is:



All About Me

We will be talking and learning about ourselves, our bodies and our senses

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- We will be learning All about Me and who is in our family. We will be thinking about similarities and differences and what makes us unique
- We will be exploring new activities and developing the children's independence
- We will talk about our emotions and to think about how we are feeling

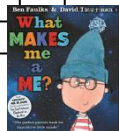


Communication and Language

- We will be singing favourite rhymes and songs and learning some new ones too
- We will be listening to different sounds in the environment
- We will listen to stories that have repeating refrains and encourage the children to join in
- We will be talking about ourselves and our families, using picture prompts to expand our vocabulary
- We will identify 'interesting' language when reading stories and try to use this in our role play and retelling

Literacy

- We use a different book each week to base our learning around. These link to our topic
- We will teach Phase 1 phonics, this term focusing on sound discrimination
- We will share lots of stories, in small groups and as a whole class
- The children will begin to recognise their name card and we encourage the children to "have a go" at writing their name on the pictures they make



Understanding the World

- We will be exploring our new environment
- We will be naming our body parts and learning about our senses
- As the weather changes, we will learn about the season Autumn and look at the changes in our environment
- In RE we will focus on being kind and learning about Harvest

Expressive Arts and Design

- The children will have the opportunity to engage in role play and small world activities
- The children will be able to explore a range of craft activities
- We will sing rhymes and songs and explore musical instruments



Maths

- We will be singing lots of number rhymes, encouraging the children to join in and show the number with their fingers
- The children will begin to recognise some numerals, particularly the ones which are important to them, such as their age
- We will look at flat shapes, naming them and talking about their properties. The children will have the opportunity to make arrangement with shapes
