Welcome to Year 3 and the Autumn Term!

We wanted to update you on a few things you may need to know this term.

Reading – Reading for pleasure is the key to reading success, so reading any story to your child will be of huge benefit to them. Any books they enjoy will help to engage them and ignite their love of books and reading - so snuggle up and get reading together. We will be focusing on developing a range of reading skills in Year 3 including: reading fluently and with expression; answering questions about the text including using inference and choosing appropriate books that interest them. Please complete their reading record once you've heard them read or read to them. We would like them to read 4 times a week where possible. Children who achieve this will get a sticker/stamp in their reading record. They will also receive a raffle ticket to go into a weekly draw to win a book from our new vending machine. This will be checked on a Friday so please begin a new page in the reading record every Friday.

PE - Our PE days are Monday and Wednesday. We will always try to go out even in cold and damp weather so children will need appropriate clothing every week!

Homework

Spelling Shed – there will be 2 games per week, one to practise the pattern taught that week and one for the Tricky words your child is working on. 10 minutes, 4 times a week is ideal.

Times Table Rockstars – Encourage your child to play on Garage. This is where we will set the children the tables they need to be working on and this will record the data for us to analyse (jamming allows the children to choose whichever times tables they would like to practise). Again, little and often is best.
