<u>P.E.</u>

Please make sure that your child comes to school wearing their full P.E. kit on Wednesdays & Fridays.

As we move in to autumn/winter, please ensure they have a sweatshirt, track suit bottoms and a lightweight waterproof jacket as we will try to go outside each week. (See website for complete kit list)

Please note: Children with pierced ears will also need to remove their own earrings. Surrey guidelines dictate that children are not allowed to apply tape or plasters to their ears. It is best to take earrings out and leave them at home on PE days. All children with long hair must keep it tied back.

Reading at Home

It is REALLY important that your child reads REGULARLY at home - reading stamina is a key aspect to success.

Please enjoy a variety of books, both fiction and non-fiction, with your children; we want children to develop a love of reading. Magazines and newspapers are a great way to engage more reluctant readers.

If appropriate, ask questions to check their understanding of the text; discuss what the book is about.

Please remember to sign your child's reading record once they have engaged with a text. Children are expected to do this at least 4 times a week.

Reading records will be collected in every Friday and the children that have read 4 times or more will be entered into a weekly raffle that is drawn every Monday in assembly. The winner gets the chance to choose a book from the vending machine.

Writing in Year 5

Focus is on a particular book that runs on a 3 week cycle:

- Independent Writing


Various writing genres are covered throughout the year alternating between fiction and non-fiction

Common Questions

- By its nature, this subject contains some sensitive subject areas. The children compile a list of ground rules for PSHE lessons, including not naming others, listening respectfully and having the 'right to pass'.
- Parents are sent a list of the objectives that will be taught every half term so that you are kept informed and can discuss issues with your child as appropriate.
- Almost all aspects of PSHE are now statutory (2020)- with the exception of money, the environment and some elements of sex education (taught in Year 5).
 We are required to teach these statutory subject areas by law and there isn't an opportunity to opt out of the learning.
- In the Growing and Changing Unit (taught in Summer 2), correct vocabulary for private parts of the body is used. This is for clarity as well as being an important part of our safeguarding remit.








- Assessment is ongoing throughout the year.
- Reading, writing and math assessments are ongoing against the children's personal targets.
- Standardised Tests three times per year to inform teacher assessment.

<u>Homework</u>

Every Monday, the children will receive two pieces of homework; one will be Maths and one will be grammar. This work will link to the previous week's learning.

Reading, times tables practise & spellings will be ongoing.

Children all have logins for Seesaw, Spelling Shed & TT TTRockstars.



Internet Safety



Social networks, apps, online streaming and computer games.
