History

In History, the children will learn about Ancient Greece – a study of Greek life and achievements and their influence on the western world, such as democracy, sports and the Olympics and theatre.



English

To link in with our history topic this half term, we will be reading The Adventures of Odysseus. The children will be writing their own re-tell of the Cyclops and Song of the Sirens story, after which they will write a recount based on other adventures in the book.



<u>PE</u>

Hockey – playing as a team; passing, intercepting and shooting.

Gym – we will be building skills on the basic gymnastic shapes: balances and developing partner sequences.

Computing

This term, the children will be learning coding – creating games using sequence, selection and repetition in Scratch including decomposition of tasks, creating sprites.







PSHE

Rights and Respect:
Understanding media bias, including social media.
The importance of communities and the environment.

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<u>RE</u>

In RE, the children will explore the principal beliefs and practices of Hinduism. We will be looking at what helps Hindus worship, including key deities and avatars of Hinduism and their place in worship,

Art

In Art and Design the children will study eyes in art, producing observational drawings of humans and dragons' eyes. They will then create dragon's eye paperweights using textures and colour with modelling clay.







Science

In Science, we will identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.

Maths

Our learning in Maths will revise and build on their understanding of:

Properties of 2D shapes
3D shape nets
Converting units
Area Perimeter Volume
Statistics
Reasoning and Problem-solving
questions

Music

In this unit we learn about the Kodaly Method and use it to explore rhythmic patterns.

Spanish

The children will learn how to describe their leisure activities and their daily routines, including telling the time.
