Living things and habitats

### PE days are Mondays and Fridays

## History

In History, the children will learn about chronology by looking at a Royal timeline. We will then look at several monarchs in turn: William the Conqueror, King John, King Henry VIII and Queen Victoria. We will finish the unit by looking at life in Victorian Britain.

## English

This half term, we will be reading a book called The Wild Robot by Peter Brown. The children will write persuasive emails to the main character to persuade them to make stay on the island and to make friends.

We really want the children to improve the presentation of their writing and to work on their spellings.



## PE

The children will have two outdoor PE sessions a week this half term. They will focus on developing their skills in tennis, and athletics.

## PSHE

# Summer 1 2026 Year 4

## RE

This half term, we will focus on Humanism with a focus on the question: how do non-religious people celebrate new life? The children will explore and understand how welcoming a new life is important for many people, but focusing specifically on Humanism as an example of non-religious worldviews. Pupils will also draw on their own experiences of milestones and events in their own lives.

## Art

In Art, the children will be looking at some famous Royal Portraits. They will then have a go at creating their own portrait of a famous monarch using watercolours.



## Science

Our topic in Science concentrates on Living things and their habitats. We will focus on:

- Classifying animals
- Vertebrates and Invertebrates
- Local Habitats
- Environmental changes

## Maths

In Maths, the children will continue to develop their understanding of decimals. The children will learn to order decimals and round decimals to the nearest whole number. The children will progress to developing their knowledge and understanding of money and time.



## Music

The children will continue to learn their brass instruments. Please ensure your child brings in their instrument **every Thursday**.

## Spanish

Looking at a map, children will identify different cities in Spain and learn to correctly pronounce their names in Spanish.
