

Following the publication of the new SEN Code of Practice (2014) there have been changes to SEN provision in school. The information below summarises the changes at Pyrford C of E Primary.

EHCP

Statements are no longer being issued. Instead children who meet the criteria will have an Education, Health and Care Plan.

Children who currently have a Statement of Educational Needs will be transferred to an EHCP over the next three years. Both parents and the school will be given notification by Surrey about when this will happen.

Single SEN support category

Children on the SEN register who do not have a Statement or EHCP will be registered under the category SEN support. This does not change their entitlement to support – this will be decided in line with the graduated approach.

Individual Support Plans

Children on the register will not have an IEP. They will be given an individual support plan instead which will detail long term outcomes for the children and the shorter-term targets in place to meet these outcomes. Pathway plans will be reviewed, written and discussed with parents on a termly basis.

One Page Profiles

Children on the SEN register will also have a One Page Profile created for them. This is to develop a more holistic view of the child and to give children the opportunity to explain what is important to them and how best to support them.

Social, Emotional and Mental Health

The SEN area which was previously called Behavioural, Emotional and Social difficulties, is now called Social, Emotional and Mental Health.
